History of the Kiwanis Club of Cable Beach

On the 20th May 1968, approximately three months after its organization on 14th February, our official anniversary date, District Governor, Laurent Girovard presented Allen Stewart, charter President of the newly formed Kiwanis Club of Cable Beach with the club's charter. The venue for the charter presentation was the Gulf Stream Room at the Nassau Beach Hotel, located in Cable Beach. The club's name is associated with the first under-sea international telegraph cable that was laid between Jupiter, Florida and New Providence. The picturesque beach line area where cable came ashore was soon to be known as Cable Beach from which the club took its name. The Cable Beach Club was co-sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Nassau and Ft. Montagu.
